When Spandau was settled by Slavic farmers around 600 AD, Berlin was still a forest primeval.



1 The Protestant Johannesstift is one of the largest diocesan institutions in Berlin and is located in the Spandauer Forst. With its red clinker brick buildings, it looks like a village in its own right: with a grocery shop, a bookshop,

a restaurant and a nursery. During

the harvest festival the whole area

becomes a festival ground

culminating in a parade.

2 With its 1,347 hectares, the **Spandauer Forst** is one of the largest forest areas in Berlin. You can marvel at the diverse flora and fauna of the mixed forest and moors on any of its many paths. Near the forester's lodge, you can observe wild animals in the enclosure from an observation

3 Located in the middle of Lake Spandau, **Eiswerder** is the only publicly accessible island in the district. Once an important Prussian military base, it became a secret food storage area for the Senate during the Cold War. Filmmaker Artur Brauner produced the famous Edgar Wallace films here in his CCC studios.

4 Surrounded by the Mühlengraben and Havel river, the Old Town lies on an island. Historic buildings such as the Gothic House, numerous shops and a wide variety of cultural and gastronomic opportunities all make visiting Berlin's longest pedestrianised zone worthwhile.


The market is the focal point of the old town. Here you can sample regional and national delicacies almost every day of the week. Festivals and events take place throughout the year. 5 Spandau's landmark, the Citadel, dates back to the 16th century – the Julius Tower from as early as the 13th century. The Citadel grounds are home to various museums and exhibition spaces (including the City History Museum, the Archaeological Window and Centre for Contemporary Art). In summer, the fortress building is a venue for concerts, in winter it is home to over 10,000 bats.

6 Narrow alleys and half-timbered houses characterise Behnitz/Kolk. A part of the old town wall from the 14th century has been preserved on the High Steinweg. The St. Marienkirche am Behnitz is the second oldest Catholic church in Berlin. Here, concerts and readings are held as well as masses.



8 The Gothic House was built from red brick in the 15th century. At that time it was one of only a few stone houses in the region, today it is the oldest town house in the city. For visitors, it is the first point of contact: On the ground floor, you will find all the information you need for your visit to Spandau in the



Tourist information office. On the upper floor, there is a branch of the City History Museum.

9 The extensive promenade on the Lindenufer lies on the Havel and runs from the Charlottenbrücke to the Juliusturmbrücke bridges below the old town. The Spree and Havel rivers converge here. Not far away is the memorial to the deported and murdered Jewish citizens of Spandau. Various boat tours to the city and the Brandenburg region start at the passenger boat pier "Spandau Lindenufer"

10 The Spandau district of Siemensstadt is full of industrial heritage. Over time, the Siemens company built numerous industrial and factory buildings as well as residential areas for workers. One example is the large housing estate Siemensstadt, which is a UNESCO World Heritage Site. The new urban quarter Siemensstadt² is currently under construction.

11 The Wild West begins in Spandau just behind the Paulsternstraße underground station Over more than 10,000 square western-style Old Texas Town with saloon, bank, printing

12 The green corridor stretches like a strip from Spandau town hall in a westerly direction to the border with Falkensee. A true recreation area has been created here, allowing you to linger Sunbathing at the lakes, climbing at the climbing rock and outdoor fitness are all possible as is a leisurely walk.

13 The Alt-Staaken village church was located only a few metres away from the inner-German border. While residents from West Berlin were forbidden to visit, it served as a parish hall for citizens from West-Staaken (then GDR territory). Inside you can admire the painting "Reconciled Unity" by Gabriele Mucchi.

14 The Hahneberg is a local recreation area. The nature reserve station at the foot of the hill provides information on the flora and fauna. Hidden away is Fort Hahneberg – one of the last new fortresses in Germany and an important hibernation site for bats. At the top of the Hahneberg is the Bruno H. Bürgel Observatory.

Art lovers can visit the gallery of the Spandau Artists' Working Group.

15 The Tiefwerder Meadows landscape protection area is crisscrossed by many old branches of the Havel River and provides a habitat for rare animal and plant species. Here you can watch water buffaloes bathing and grazing. To explore the ramified area, we recommend a paddle tour.

16 The Rieselfelder Karolinenhöhe were used to biologically purify waste water and can be traced back to an idea by James Hobrecht and Rudolf von Virchow. You can explore this beautiful area on foot or by bike along any of its many paths.

17 The Military History Museum at the former airfield in Gatow is dedicated to military aviation in Germany. Queen Elizabeth II even landed here during her visits to Berlin. In spacious hangars and an open-air exhibition, aircraft tell their stories

spanning over a century of history.

18 The Windmühlenberg is crowned by a **post windmill**. The area is a protected nature reserve because of the steppe vegetation that is rare to Berlin. In the nearby manor you can visit the Garden of World Religions and a café.

20 The Gutspark Neukladow s a must for every visitor to Spandau. The park's location on a plateau offers the best view over the Havel river to the lake at Wannsee. In the former manor house there is a café and restauheld here, as are exhibitions.

LANDHAUSGARTEN

OFF TO SPANDAU

With its historic old town, fortress buildings, fascinating industrial heritage and green oases, Spandau is an Eldorado for explorers. At the confluence of the Spree and Havel rivers - only a few kilometres from Potsdam.

FROM THE OLD TOWN TO THE CITADEL

The old town with its lively pedestrian zone awaits you in the heart of the district. Marvel at Spandau's many sights as you walk down the historic alleys and round off the day in one of the neighbourhood pubs.

For art and culture lovers, Spandau's museums and galleries offer many things to see and do.

Once a fortress and garrison town and protector of Berlin, Spandau developed into an important industrial location. Today, the Spandau Citadel is considered the best-preserved Renaissance fortress in Europe.

Art lovers can enjoy its galleries and museums, music fans flock to the Citadel for festivals and concerts, and nature lovers take part in bat tours. There is an audio guide for the Old Town and the Citadel, which you can download in the free Lauschtour app.

TURBULENT TIMES - BETWEEN EAST AND WEST

During the Cold War, the Wall and border fortifications separa ted the people of Spandau and their neighbours in Havelland Falkensee and Potsdam. Today, there are many places along t former border whose stories are entwined with past division. The western route of the Berlin Wall Trail runs for over 20 kilometres through the district.

Even Albert Einstein enjoyed the Havel flair in the "Spandauer Schloss" (Spandau castle), his summerhouse on the Scharfe Lanke lake.

SO GREEN - AND BUILT CLOSE TO WATER

Hike across expansive meadows and fields, stroll along the banks of the Havel river, or discover Spandau by boat. Those looking for rural wonders and water will find it in the green south. Here you can buy fresh regional products directly from the farmer or in the village shop. In the north lies the green heart of the district. The Spandauer Forst, one of the largest wooded areas in Berlin, is known for its diverse flora and fauna. Just around the corner are several bathing spots where you can enjoy a refreshing dip in the Havel.



CYCLING IN SPANDAU

A wonderful way to explore Spandau and its many highlights is to take a tour by bicycle. With the Berlin Wall Trail, the Berlin-Copenhagen Cycle Path and the Havel and Havelland Cycle Path, our central routes run through the district. Those who want to take a thematic voyage of discovery can get to know the industrial past on "Production + Munition" or the more natural sides of the district on the way to the "Green South".

PILGRIMAGE TO SPANDAU

The Spandau Protestant church community opened the Spandau Pilgrimage Trail in 2020. It connects 24 Protestant and two Catholic churches in the district over a 75 km distance and is divided into three circular routes: city, countryside and river. There is also a circular bicycle route.
